The Mayor called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.
The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Beth Williams.
Prayer was given by B.J. Driskoll.
Sandy was excused due to personal leave.

Lorin moved to approve the consent agenda items #4a and 4b with no changes. Steve seconded the motion and Lorin voted aye; Steve, aye; John, aye; and Charlotte, aye. It was a unanimous vote to accept them.

Bruce R. Cook was honored for his six years of service in the Planning and Zoning Committee for the City. John commended his fine work and the Mayor presented him with a plaque.

Farrell Steiner audited the City for 2005-2006. He pointed out that our five to six year trends are fairly even. He found clean records and that the City is in good financial shape. The City refinanced a bond last year and saved over a hundred thousand dollars because of it. There were no budget violations. He found no exceptions with the internal controls. The Mayor thanked him. Farrell left copies of the audit for the City to have on file. John moved to approve the audit and John seconded the motion. It was a unanimous vote in favor of the motion.

Hobbs Middle School 6th grade students, with the student teacher Brooke Webber from BYU – Idaho, presented a display board showing problems with traffic on S. Lincoln Ave. and Short Ave. around Hobbs Middle School. They suggested the City change S. Lincoln to one way traffic flowing south and Short, to northbound. The students did not talk to anyone from the

Church or to all of the neighbors who would be most impacted by the change. Chief Alan Dial talked to Ron Searle, but not the Church. He suggested that the school pave Little Street and put parking there for the employees. He said he watched the traffic around the school on a couple of occasions and the problem would not be fixed by making the traffic one way. The students were directed by the Council to ask the Church and the residents what they feel about this kind of change. Alan also suggested the school make bus parking like they did at Goodsell. The Mayor directed the students to meet with Alan and try to work out a better solution. Teacher Linda Cummings asked if they could look at other options, such as timed parking. A petition handed out by the students to about 50 teachers, 50 adult citizens (including some of the neighbors), and 50 teachers were handed out. Of those who responded, a lot of the adults said there was a problem and the students said there was not.

Neil Sims did not attend the meeting.

The Girl Scouts were not in attendance, but the Mayor read and signed a proclamation making March 11th through the 17th the Girl Scouts Make the World a Better Place Week. The girls would be selling cookies and then sending cookies to the U. S. Armed Forces in Iraq.

Gables Management withdrew from the agenda.

Diane Mickelson presented a tentative agenda for the 2007 Riverfest. It was scheduled to be a two-day event with many new activities. It would be held on Friday and Saturday, June 8th and 9th. They wanted to include a dance in Brinkman Park parking lot. The new part of the walking path along South Hanson Avenue would have a ribbon cutting ceremony if it was completed by then. Other ideas were presented for the Council's information.

John reported that the Urban Renewal Phase Two was in progress and he wanted to really push Phase Three.

Mike Carter, Rocky Mountain Power Company, and Jeff Bennett, Lumatech Company, talked with the Council about the new l.e.d. street lights that have more light and less cost to run. Glen Pond, Rocky Mountain Power, said the company was getting figures on set rates for street lights; he would pass those numbers on to Shelley when he received them. Jeff gave a presentation on the lights, how they work, how they would be converted, etc. Jeff was asked to correspond with John regarding this matter.

There were no citizens from the floor.

The Mayor proclaimed May 19th as Shelley Arbor Day. It was established for the Arbor Day

Celebration and for Shelley to re-qualify as a Tree City, USA.

B.J. said he had experience with Bonneville County employees. He said it was good to work with the people in Shelley. He said the State of Idaho Fifth District Judicial Court granted a partial decree for groundwater rights # 27-07053 and #27-04107 for the existing wells. The City also received a copy for their records. He would continue to work on obtaining rights for a new well.

Dawn reported that the Library asked to do the swimming pool passes again; she would go ahead with that. Softball was beginning that week. Fun Shot was going and she had a blood drive on March 14th.

Charlotte said the School District wanted to place a mobile home on their land for two classrooms. She presented the new Shelley City Flag to the Mayor and City Council. It was complimented by everyone.

John suggested the City find a way to work with the Dept. of Agriculture because of the crippling effect the nematode has had on the area regarding growth. He asked if it was a serious issue or if the federal government was making it one. The Mayor said it was a serious problem.

John had been approached by two businesses who wanted to develop by Industrial Park. There was Urban Renewal money set aside to help take the sewer to the business park. Steve said there was also grant money to go for. There was a small plumbing business and a small manufacturing business proposed by young Shelley people and John wanted to encourage them.

Steve had opportunity to talk to the Governor and his staff regarding the nematodes. They were very aware of the problem and were sympathetic, but that was about all he got from them. The Mayor may be contacted by an aide to the Governor. He said the Brinkman Park grant was only waiting for a letter to go ahead. Hopefully the restroom would be finished in time for the Riverfest. He also helped get money for Bingham County for waterways projects while in Boise.

Lorin asked Charlotte if the school talked about the 4-A/3-A classification. She said it was still the same; they were considering the potential growth. He asked the procedure for obtaining Urban Renewal money and where the boundaries were.

Lorin was asked by the Mayor to serve as a member in the Greater Idaho Falls Chamber of Commerce. He accepted and would serve on it for a year to see if it was beneficial for Shelley.

The Mayor said it was before the State Senate to possibly stop changes to boundaries in Urban


Renewal Districts. It was approved in the House of Representatives; the City was waiting to see what would happen.

Lorin reported that Brent Christensen said he would pave the roads in the North Shelley Business Park by May 1st. He would have to get his water testing done. He would have to clean out the sewer line. He had to run a utility bore under Anderson Road. He had his street lights in. Four buildings were constructed and a car wash wanted to start building soon. Brent was looking to have the curbs in by April 15th. Chuck reminded the Council that Brent also needed to have the compaction test and the water test done before he could continue.

The Mayor said the Canadian company, Iogen, had received federal funding for an ethynol plant to be constructed in Shelley. It was the largest potential user of the proposed wastewater treatment plant. The downside was that the residents were concerned with the smell.

The Mayor said the mayors of the area were meeting with INL March 15th to show their support of a contract INL was trying to obtain.

John asked to be excused for the next meeting as he would be out of town. The Council Meeting adjourned at 9:51 p.m.
