A roll call vote was called for: Charlotte – aye, John – aye, Kurt – aye, and Earl - aye.  
Approved unanimously.

John moved, Charlotte seconded to approve a General Business License for Safe Haven Health at 183 E. Oak for 2010. Approved unanimously.

Sandy said there were twenty businesses that had not filed renewal applications for business licenses for 2010. She said there were also six businesses that never applied for licenses in 2009, but the city had just been made aware that the businesses existed. Sandy said letters with applications had never been sent to those six businesses. However, the twenty businesses that have not applied for renewal licenses have been notified twice regarding their license for 2010. Sandy stated that violation of the licensing ordinance is a misdemeanor. She asked the council how they would like her to proceed on this matter. Council directed Sandy to draft one more letter to the business owners that need to renew their license, and specify that the violation to the ordinance is considered a misdemeanor. After the third letter if there is no response issue a citation to the business owner.

Kurt said he met with Dawn and Jacqueline Wittwer regarding the free pool passes for the summer library reading program. He said his recommendation would be to issue pool passes to be used on a one to one ratio; such as one paying person with one free pass. Kurt recommended limiting the number of free passes to two hundred for the season. Mrs. Wittwer said they would have to set higher standards to receive the passes if two hundred was all they could have. She

asked for two hundred and fifty, but the council agreed two hundred would be the limit. The council felt the library could determine has to use the two hundred passes.

BJ said he will be prepared at the next council meeting for the public hearing regarding the sale of the city owned property at 176 S. State Street. He said he will also have the base contract with Forsgren Engineering reviewed and ready for comment.

Dawn said this Saturday will be the last Saturday for Jazz Basketball. She said she will be giving tee shirts for sportsmanship awards.

Dawn said there will be a blood drive on March 2, 2010, at City Hall.

Dawn said the pool drain will be worked on to meet regulations once the weather permits.

Kurt said he attended the Planning and Zoning workshop in Pocatello on February 20<sup>th</sup>. He said there was a lot of information given which was a bit overwhelming. However, the information given was very good.

Kurt said he has received several questions regarding the new animal control shelter. He asked if the city will be hiring someone to man the new building. Mayor Christensen said the city does not have the resources right now to financially hire a full time animal control person. He said in the future the city may be able to work with the county on sharing an officer. Earl said he and Alan have discussed this and are developing some options.

Earl said the advertising on the new benches in the city look nice.


