Mayor Pascoe opened the meeting at 7:31 p.m.

Kim moved, Earl seconded to approve the following consent agenda:

Building Permits:

A roll call vote was taken: Earl - aye, Kim - aye, Jeff - aye, and Adam - aye.
Approved unanimously.

Shannon Weaver was not in attendance to discuss the goat she currently has in the city limits. She discussed this at the last council meeting and said she was currently in the process of having her animal registered as an "emotional support animal". BJ was directed to obtain more information regarding the guidelines for emotional support animals. BJ said he researched this issue and could find no statutes which would change or "except" our current ordinance which does not allow goats within city limits except in an RA zone. Mayor Pascoe said he wants to uphold our city ordinances. Earl said it is unfortunate, but a goat is not allowed by city code, or any applicable State or Federal codes that would change that. Kim said she understands Ms. Weaver and she is a pet owner herself, however she is worried about a box that could be opened if Ms. Weaver is allowed to keep a goat in city limits. She said Ms. Weaver has been told once before that it is against our city ordinance, and feels we should hold to our code. Mayor Pascoe said he feels it is important to uphold our city ordinances. Earl moved, Kim seconded to uphold our city ordinance and not allow the goat to be kept within city limits as Ms. Weaver has requested. Approved unanimously.

Paige Hall, 339 Brent Way said one year ago on Friday was the most horrific night of her life. She said she cannot change the moment she had, but maybe she can

help someone else. Mrs. Hall said on July 15th an officer came to her home regarding an accident concerning Robert. She said she has a husband and a son both named Robert. The officer indicated he thought it was her son. Mrs. Hall said he could not give her hardly any information other than she should get in her car and head towards the site of the accident. She said he told her this information in front of her children as well as another child (not a family member). As he was leaving he used the word fatality. Mrs. Hall said as a council she wants them to know that the officer failed his duties that day. She said he did not know all of the information, and caused unnecessary confusion that day as well as scared her young children. She said our officers need more training on this matter. She said now when she sees this officer it causes her stress. Mrs. Hall said this officer did irreparable damage to her family that day and she wanted the Mayor and Council to know. Earl said he understands that she is upset and distraught. He said the officer was asked by another agency to give her this information. Earl said this kind of information is not the kind of information that an officer likes to give. He said he doesn't know how to fix this, but the officer has been giving this type of information for a long time. Earl said the officer did not just hear the information on the radio and just run to tell her; he was asked to. Mayor Pascoe said he feels the city could do some more training so we can do the best we can in these types of situations. Mrs. Hall said she spoke with the State Police and they were surprised this information was told in front of miners and there should have been two officers, and they would never have sent somebody on the road. She said the State as well as the other agencies involved said they did not contact this officer and ask him to give her the information about the accident. Jeff asked if the city has protocol for this type of situation. Rod said no, but he would send two officer if they are available. Jeff said he agrees that this type of information should not be given in front of minors. Kim said we are all in agreement that something should be done regarding training. Jeff said there could have been multiple officers communicating that caused some confusion. Mayor said the information could have come through dispatch. Jeff said there are things that could be improved upon, but the officer did not do this intentionally. Earl and the other Board Members thanked Mrs. Hall for coming in, and Earl said he will look into this matter further.

Rod said he would like to fill the vacancy left by Tyson Gunderson. He said he would like to recommend Josh Eaton to fill the spot. He said Josh grew up here and he currently lives in Shelley and has two children. Rod said all tests have been passed except the psychological exam. Earl moved, Jeff seconded to hire Josh Eaton at entry level with a one year probationary period pending a psychological evaluation. Approved unanimously.

Sandy said she has started the budget process, and will talk to the Council about setting up a work meeting.

Sandy presented some information she received from REDI and IDWR for the Mayor and Council to review.

Scott said he has been researching the ability to sign up and pay for sports programs on line. He said it will not cost anything to setup, however the users of the program will pay a fee. Scott said there will also be the ability to provide "fan

gear" on the website. Kim asked if people would be able to register for swimming lessons on line also. Scott said he and Pam have discussed this. Sandy said there may be some problems in regards to the extra \$10 fee those outside city limits are charged for sports programs and swimming lessons. She said a lot of people think they are in the city limits just because they have a Shelley address. Sandy said only those with a city address, and not a grid address is actually within the city limits with a few exceptions. Scott said he addressed these problems with the software company, and they believe they can overcome them. Scott said he is hoping to have this set up by the end of the month.

Justin said the crew is busy doing asphalt work. He said he has talked to most all of the businesses regarding grease traps and only four did not have them. He said he has also been getting bids for overlays on several of the city streets.

Rod said he would like to mention that our community has given the Police Department their support and appreciation regarding the incidents that have occurred in Dallas, and Louisiana, etc. He said he is very thankful to live in this community. He said it is nice to know that people care and we live in a great city.

Adam said he agrees with rod. He said we have a great police force and they do a great job.

Kim said Pam wants to give "kudos" to all of the city crew for all of their help at the pool.

Kim said the Snow Shack was vandalized and there has been a lot of information on Facebook about people's property getting egged. Rod said the Police Department has not received any complaints about the egging's.

Jeff said he has a call into the State Highway Department to see when they State Highway will be overlaid. Justin said there is a meeting in Blackfoot next week that he plans to attend with the Highway Department. Mayor asked Jeff to put the phone number to the Highway District out to the citizens so they can contact ITD about the condition of the road.

Jeff said the Recreation District petitions are out for the public to view. He asked for everyone's help obtaining the needed signatures to get this on the ballot. Jeff said anyone signing needs to be register to vote in the Shelley School District. He said our goal is to get 1100 signatures.

Mayor Pascoe said he appreciates Justin and his crew. He said they have been busy trying to keep water lines repaired as well as the sprinkler systems in the parks. He said he appreciates Scott for his job and getting the information to register on line. He also said he appreciates Rod's Department, the Council Members and Sandy and her staff, and BJ and Dave.
